


Windows 2000 Dial-up Internet Connection


1. Click the **Start** button, select **Settings**, and then select **Network and Dial-up Connections**. Click **Make New Connection**.



2. Click **Next**.




3. Select **Dial-up to the Internet**.



4. Select **I want to set up my Internet connection manually, or I want to connect through a local area network (LAN)**. Click **Next**.




5. Select **I connect through a phone line and a modem**. Click **Next**.





6. Enter your **Area code**, **Telephone number** and **Country/region name and code**. Click **Next**.





8. In the **Connection Name** field type **FKBNet**. Click **Next**.




9. Select **No**. Click **Next**.




10. Uncheck the **To connect to the Internet immediately** box. Click **Finish**.
